Monika Leone's range extends from the functional to the sculptural. Majolica bowls, cups and vases are embellished with gold lustre while Raku-fired boxes and vases can be both decorative and functional after being treated with a sealant. Monika's hand-built vessels consist of layering different clays together.

Update from the Board on the Review of our Constitution

In the months since our AGM earlier this year we have been reviewing the issues that arose during the AGM regarding the proposed amendments to our Constitution. We've been able to determine that a number of changes that were proposed were not contentious but needed to be written more clearly and then discussed with the membership before being brought to a formal meeting for acceptance.

Those issues are:

Proxy votes. We believe that the majority of members are happy to retain proxy votes – and we'll streamline the words around this by drafting up a template for the proxy form which makes it explicit what are the proxy permission limits – eg. proxies only used at each AGM, not for use at special meetings or to resolve special resolutions.

Electronic voting. Our Board Member lan Hodgson has done some research on e-voting (including how it is handled by the Australian Electoral Commission) and we believe it can be done relatively simply and to keep costs down. We'll come to you in future newsletters with the wording for a process for electronic voting that can be adopted into the constitution without committing future boards to use it – but the option will exist.

Minimum age. Because we have family memberships as part of our membership structure, the children that are members via a family membership could vote unless we specify a minimum age. We will specify 16 years as the minimum age for voting.

The next step in our process is to host two consultation/information evenings in which we want to hear from as many members as possible about the contentious issues. We believe the three contentious questions are:

- 1. Is it important that CPS members directly elect the President?
- 2. How important is it for the members to elect all of the Board Members?
- 3. How many board members can be non-members (ie, not potters)?

Therefore, you are invited to attend one of two information and discussion evenings where we will talk through two options for each of these questions. Using your feedback we will then finalise a draft constitution for formal consideration early in 2017.

The two consultation sessions are Sunday 4 December – at 3pm with afternoon tea and Tuesday 6 December - 7pm with supper. Both meetings will be held at Canberra Potters, 1 Aspinall Street, Watson.

In next month's edition of this newsletter we will describe to you the two options for each of the three questions above - and we'll be glad to receive emails or phone calls from anyone unable to come along in person on either Sunday 4 or Tuesday 6 Decmber.

French Connection II

In France pottery markets are everywhere. Member Jackie Lallemand reports on October's "Fete des Potiers" at Auvillar.

Auvillar, a town with many galleries in SW France, has the title "Les plus beaux villages de France" - the most beautiful villages. Originally settled as a fortress and market town in the mid 1500s, it stands high above the river Garonne and has a distinctive circular grain auction pavillion with a central "stage". This was a wonderful venue for the pottery market.

There were 54 regional stall holders and most of the galleries also had extensive pottery exhibitions. There was pottery of all shapes and sizes, both utilitarian and decorative, and many demonstrations.

One gallery is owned by successful painter Nanie Azuelos and potter Daniel Azuelos. They hosted several clay artists in parallel with the pottery expo, including François Gallissaires, salt glazed stoneware, Claude Champy, high temp.stoneware, Lea Pludwinski, animals and people slipped and waxed, some raku and some higher fired; also 2 members of the "Ceramics International Academy": Nani Champy and Daniela Schlagenhauf.

Ceramic Accord was an exhibition in the WAC gallery of the work of four ceramic artists based in Central Western NSW – Marjo Carter, Margaret Ling, Valerie Stuart and Pauline Wellfare – and one, Vicki Passlow, from the NSW South Coast.

Although coming from diverse backgrounds and experience, and primarily working as individual practitioners, meetings and discussions provided the five with a strong sense of accord, hence the exhibition's title. Whilst seeking to preserve the integrity of individual style and expression, this exhibition aimed to present harmony in diversity, which it did admirably.

Valerie Stuart draws inspiration from everyday forms and textures and from the perennial shapes that have stood the test of time and yet still have universal appeal. Her work in

the exhibition was primarily hand built using a combination of slab, coil and press moulding and showed a variety of surface decoration and firing techniques, mostly pit-firing in saggars with oxides and organic material.

Pauline Wellfare works predominately with porcelain, which is sometimes coloured with oxides and stains, and most often polished rather than glazed. This polished surface with its warm, almost buttery finish, was beautifully represented on many of her exhibited works while others, taller vases and bottles, showed her skill at carving and cutting the clay surface.

A combination of simple clean lines and a diversity of restrained decorative features are the mark of Marjo Carter's work. Drawing inspiration from many sources, such as the undulating paling fences that predominate in the landscape of historic Hill End, to bright sunny days and the vivid blues of coastal waters, her exhibited works represented an eclectic mix of surface decoration and techniques.

Margaret Ling exhibited five large bottles and a platter that showed not just her mastery of wood-firing but also her mastery of hand building large forms that can withstand the rigours of this firing method. The exhibits showed the transformation of simple shino and ash glazes in the potent atmosphere of the wood-fired kiln.





Vicki Passlow's fascination with the way that one element – the sinuous line – can capture landscape, nature and the essence of movement was reflected in porcelain forms with soft organic shapes. Colour was achieved by the use of metal salts, which, like watercolour paints, lend themselves to soft-edged, subtle variations and overlaying of colours. Small-scale crystal formations echoed the mottling of mosses, or rust on metal, enhancing the polished surfaces.


