Gas kiln firing course this February with Chris Harford

Feb 24, March 9 & 10

This course runs over three days, with a two week gap in the middle to allow time for students to prepare and glaze their work. You will learn all about how the kiln works, what reduction does to glazes and clay, and be able to fire your own work. At the successful completion of the course CPS members will be licensed to fire the CPS gas kilns.

Firing the Electric Kiln – with Richilde Flavell

March 17 & 24 This course is run over two Sunday mornings.

This course is a complete introduction to firing the electric kiln – *packing*, *firing*, *maintenance and safety*. You will receive a CPS Kiln licence at



the successful completion of this course.

Skill set – Choosing and Preparing Clay

Sunday April 8

Suitable for all potters from beginners to the more experienced who want to learn more about the properties of different clays, wedging and recycling

Playing with Pinched Pottery

March 17, 24, 31

Cost \$180 – includes clay and bisque firing. In this course Sue Cant will lead you through an exploration of the possibilities provided by pinching to create sophisticated and varied artworks.

Easter Teapot workshop with Chris Harford April 19, 20 and 21

Suitable for intermediate to advanced throwers (minimum skill level is to be able to centre and pull up a cylinder without assistance).

Skill sets that will be a focus of this course include:

- the elements of teapot design
- designing functional shapes
- throwing spouts
- making lids and galleries
- making handles
- trimming
- fitting and assembling thrown pieces

Intensive Introduction to Clay

March - Saturday 9, Sunday 10, Monday 11, and Sunday 24 (fully booked) April - Saturday 13, Sunday 14, Monday 15, and Sunday 28

This course takes students through all the basic hand building and wheel throwing techniques for working with clay.

THE IMPORTANCE OF CLEANING

This term we are focusing on providing a safe and healthy environment for students and staff. Working with clay is a naturally messy process and long term exposure to clay dust can have serious health consequences. Clean up is an essential part of the process for class participants and those using the members workshop. Canberra Potters expects all class participants and members to clean their own work space and/or wheel at the end of each class/session and to contribute to the general end of class clean up before leaving. Members are expected to contribute to maintaining the overall cleanliness of the members workshop.



Cleaning requirements:

- Allow ten minutes at then end of your session/class to clean up.
- All areas should be wet wiped and dried with a towel including wheels and benches.
- Check under the wheel head and clean away any residual clay.
- Batts and tools need to be washed, dried and put away.
- Talk to your teacher if you are unsure what to do or have any questions.
- Notify staff if you observe any Heath & Safety issues or concerns as soon as possible

Just a reminder that cleaning up includes the common kitchen area, tearoom and library. If you take a break for a cuppa or snack please wash, dry and put your cup away and wipe over the table area, dispose of your rubbish and return any books/magazines you have been reading.
