A celebration of 40 years of wood firing in
Gundaroo by Ian Jones
November 7 to December 1
Opening 6pm Thursday 7 November 2019

A professional potter for forty years, Ian has been making ceramics since 1984 at his Old St Luke's Studio in Gundaroo. Inspired by his deep interest in the contemporary wood-fire movement, Ian has studied and travelled internationally exploring and developing his skills as well as mentoring other artists at this studio.

Jones lived in Japan for three years in the early 1990s studying ceramics and teaching English. During this time, he assisted Hon ma Shunuchi in Fujisawa, Asao Kempei in Iga-ueno and Kudo Shuji in Miyagi Prefecture with firings and attained Level 2 in the Japanese Proficiency Exam.

As an established potter with both a national and international reputation, this exhibition is an important inclusion in our 2019 exhibition program.

Coinciding with his exhibition *Ash* and *Clay:* A *Celebration of 40 Years of Woodfiring in Gundaroo*, lan Jones will give a talk about his practice so far and his current work.

TECHNICAL NEWS

Kiln Bookings

As the end of the year approaches lots of members are busy preparing for markets and Christmas sales.

To ensure a fair and equitable process for all members we ask that you use the following guidelines when booking kilns through December.

Members are asked to limit electric kiln bookings to two for the month of December. This
is to ensure equity of access for members. Remaining kiln bookings are required to
ensure CPS student work can be fired before the end of the year.

- Kiln invoices will only be issued to the person who books the kiln. If you are sharing a kiln you will need to make your own arrangements for dividing shares of the invoice.
- Student work is now tracked through the kilns to ensure a timely firing response. Please do not back fill your kiln with CPS work. Only fire your own work, or your group's work in the kiln.
- For electric firings above Cone 6 we ask that you use Kiln 3. Please ensure you use 4
 props per shelf for higher firings.
- Due to increased demand of gas kilns only one kiln may be booked at a time.
- Should you need a simultaneous firing we ask that you discuss your booking with the Technical Manager.

Collection of Work

The Kiln staff have been working hard to move your work through the kilns as quickly as possible. Kilns are now regularly unpacked on Mondays and Thursday. These are the days to start looking for new work on the fired work shelves.
