"I am a local Canberra region artist living on a rural property in Sutton NSW. The peaceful bush setting of my home and my love for the natural environment informs the ceramic work I make. My work is hand thrown on the potters wheel and glazed in simple glazes which respond to the clay body used. I approach making as a calming meditative practice and keep my forms gentle and understated as a reflection of the calmness the practice brings me. I intentionally leave parts of the clay body exposed as an appreciation of the beauty that is the colour and texture of the clay itself. I use various clay bodies, occasionally mixing two or more together. The forms are fired in either a gas reduction kiln or oxidising electric kiln depending on the desired appearance of the clay body."

"The regenerative earth-care system of permaculture, with its emphasis on self-reliance and positive actions to work harmoniously with nature, has been widely adopted around the globe. The permaculture principles are design guidelines about how we can live harmoniously within the finite resources of earth and its inhabitants.

The pieces in this exhibition are part of a series of ceramic works that respond creatively to the twelve principles of permaculture. The principle "Design from Patterns to Details" encourages us to step back so we can observe patterns in nature and consider the bigger picture. For example, by mapping the contours of mountains we can see the broader landscape and its patterns. Although each mountain is unique, there are universal similarities that govern the structures of them, regardless of size, age or origin. Mt Majura, a bush clad mountain on the edge of the northern suburbs of Canberra, is widely used by walkers and features heavily in this body of work. We may be unaware of the

universal patterns when we are enjoying a walk on the trails of Majura, or any other mountain, but it is fascinating to reflect on their interconnectedness. Equally, it is interesting how little we know about these patterns and how much we still have to learn about the planet we live and depend on. A larger examination of all 12 Permaculture Principles will be the subject of an exhibition at Craft + Design Canberra in 2024."

"I create sculptural ceramic vessels that investigate the subtleties and complexities of pattern and texture. A range of coiling techniques are used, with coils sometimes flattened and broken into small segments to generate a textured surface which is evident on both the exterior and interior of the form. Working in this detailed and repetitive manner brings a slow and meditative rhythm to my making process. Inspiration stems from observations and emotional responses to the natural environment, and recent works evoke the severe climatic conditions of drought and fire. The granite boulders and eucalyptus forests of our cool dry region have been a particularly strong influence. Working with clay gives me an element of unpredictability and randomness that I enjoy. Porcelain gives the best expression for the colour palette and surface texture of my work. Discovering and utilising the borer beetle patterns on the eucalyptus trees where I live has opened a range of possibilities for surface decoration for functional ware and non-functional pieces. This has given the rich patterns made in the life cycle of these insects some visibility and credibility as one of nature's recyclers. I am also working towards a sustainable ceramic practice, using solar energy for my firings".
